

+ FLU SEASON IS HERE!



Flu season is here and our invites for the free flu vaccine have started being sent out to eligible patients.

The flu vaccine helps protect against flu, which can be a serious or life-threatening illness. It's offered on the NHS every year in autumn or early winter to people at higher risk of getting seriously ill from flu.

Most eligible adults will be able to get the flu from 3rd October 2024. This may be later than you've had it before, but it means you'll have the best protection when flu is most widespread. Pregnant women and children aged 2-3yrs may have their vaccine from September 2024.

How to get the free flu vaccine at your GP surgery?

We made it easy for you:

- **1.No Appointment Needed**: Simply attend the clinic based on the first letter of your surname.
- **2.Missed Your Day?** No problem! Attend the next available clinic.
- **3.Ad Hoc Vaccinations**: If you're visiting the practice, you can request the flu vaccine from the receptionist.
- **4.During Appointments**: You can also receive the flu vaccine during any pre-booked appointment. We are arranging for special visits for our housebound patients.

Respiratory syncytial virus (RSV) Vaccine

The RSV Vaccine helps reduce the risk of Respiratory Syncytial Virus (RSV) causing serious problems such as pneumonia and bronchiolitis.

Who's at risk from RSV?

- babies under 6 months old
- adults over 75 years
- babies, children and adults with a weakened immune system

RSV Vaccination is recommended if


- you're pregnant (from 28weeks of pregnancy)
- you're aged 75 to 79

If you're aged 75 to 79, we will contact you about getting vaccinated.

If you're 28 weeks pregnant or more, you can speak to your maternity service about getting vaccinated.

Covid-19 Autumn Booster

Who's eligible for the 2024 COVID-19 vaccine, or 'Autumn Booster'?

- adults aged 65years and over
- residents in a care home for older adults
- individual aged 6months to 64years in a clinical risk group
- frontline NHS and social care workers, and those working in a care home for other people

COVID vaccinations will be administered centrally by the Network (PCN) Primary Care drop-in clinics through at Marlborough House. More information will follow, and we will update our website accordingly. visits for housebound Home patients will be arranged by the same service.

Consent and sharing information

All clinical and administrative staff working in the NHS have a legal duty to keep information about you confidential. The clinicians will not disclose information about your health without your permission, This means you can tell others about your visit at the surgery, but we won't!

Disclosure to Third Parties

At Station Practice, we take your privacy seriously. This includes your medical records, which contain sensitive information about your health. Sometimes, you may wish to share this information with someone else, such as a family member or carer. This is where third-party consent comes in.

Third-party consent means giving someone else permission to access your medical records. It's important to understand that this is a significant decision with potential implications.

If you wish to go ahead and organise third-party consent you can simply complete a form with the representative you are allowing access and return this to the Practice.

In summary, if we do not have your explicit consent to share information from your medical records, we will not share it, even with a family member.





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Cancelling your appointment!



IF YOU CAN'T MAKE IT, CANCEL IT Forgetting to cancel your unwanted GP appointment can prevent someone else from being seen. So if you can't make it, cancel it. Missed appointments are one of the main factors which contribute to a strain on time and resource within the NHS, so reducing them is essential for both improving patients' access to health services and reducing the demand for appointments.

There are things you can do to help reduce DNAs:

- Cancel your appointment by phoning us on 01424 464 756, Monday to Friday or by using the 'cancel' option on your Online Access account or by texting back on the appointment reminder 'CANCEL'
- Make sure all your details are up-todate next time you visit your GP – that way we can send you text reminders;
- Put the date in the diary or an alert in your phone so you definitely won't forget!
